Most operators I've talked with recently say that acres sprayed have decreased compared to the last few years. Certain parts of Alberta were hit with severe drought and were classed as disaster areas. Other areas that have had minimal moisture reported yields 25%-30% below the five year average. Looking back in recent history it seems that approximately every five years of fair to good moisture conditions are followed by a couple of dry years. Given that, are we possibly going to experience another dry season next year?

As mentioned in the spring news letter, the AAAA's board has been realizing that the association's bylaws are in need of some changes. A committee was formed this past spring to review the bylaws and to bring recommendations for the board to consider at the next board meeting on October 14, 2015. Alberta pilot found guilty of applying pesticide without a license

An Alberta pilot has been found guilty of applying pesticide without a valid registration. Randal Seaholm, of Manning, was handed a \$1,000 fine and has been prohibited from applying any pesticide from an aircraft for a period of one year.

The charges stemmed from aerial spraying that occurred between August 24th and 25th of 2012. Seaholm applied pesticide to agricultural land when he did not have a valid pesticide service registration. Alberta Environment conducts routine operation inspections and responds to public and industry complaints about improper pesticide management.

Alberta Aviation Focus Group

Through a series of four focus groups, Aviation Alberta is looking at how its long-term strategy can be considered. The focus groups, in Edmonton, Calgary and Fort McMurray are intended to drive a conversation about how Aviation Alberta can advocate for the aviation sector and how the association can work with the provincial government to continue to build a robust aviation industry. Jill Lane and I attended one of these sessions in Edmonton on September 15th.

The provincial government, through Alberta Transportation, has embarked on a review of their strategy and in communicating with senior officials in the department; Aviation Alberta agrees that the association wants to align its strategy with Alberta Transportation's as much as possible while still being true to the spirit that has built the aviation sector in Alberta over the past century.

Alberta Transportation has identified that their long-term strategy needs to be multi-modal, integrated, cost-effective and environmentally responsible. These are topics that are also important to members of Alberta Aviation.



Aviation Alberta has commissioned a survey of its members as part of the strategy update. They have asked all interested parties to complete this survey as they prepare their report.
